Educational analytics, Data analytics for social media, Content development and metadata management, Business intelligence etc.

The Workshop provided a framework for presentation of AComIn results in intelligent management of digital content, grouped in the following topics:

- Development of large-scale linguistic resources for Bulgarian language
- Educational analytics for increasing user involvement in eLearning
- Sentiment analysis of annotated images based on image tags
- Information extraction of patient-related entities from large repositories of medical texts in Bulgarian language
